**Purchasing Agent:** Steve reported that there was a surplus in the 18/19 budget year. He handed Bob Tait the invoices from Sandy Hook, Botsford and Dodgingtown for new Tanker fit outs and Bob Tait proposed the transfer the funds to pay them. He asked Steve to go to the Selectmen's meeting to propose to Board and it passed.

## Combined Chiefs:

- Chief Halstead asked for all chiefs to inventory their pagers and radios.
- He asked Steve Murphy to look back at the last few years expenditures and get dollar figures on Pager and Radio repairs.
- Chief Halstead invited all companies to a 4 Night Training in September on noncertified safety officer class starting Sept. 5<sup>th</sup> anyone interested in attending is invited.

## **Reports from Standing Committees**

- Policy & Procedures Committee:
- Purchasing Agent / Chief Murphy asked the Policy and Procedures committee to look into writing policy for increasing daytime driver pay. Sub-committee has been formed to look at this- Bob Kick, Jeff Dugan and Ron Bolmer and they will meet with the Chiefs at the next Chiefs meeting. Steve will break down the account that account for Pay Per Call, Pension and Daytime Paid drivers.
- Steve Murphy also informed that the same company (Fail Safe) that does hose testing can also do nozzle and appliance testing as well. Can alternate with hard suction testing.
- According to NFPA they suggest replacement of turnout gear every 10 years, the expense is astronomical. Look for an alternative to replacing gear. Bob Kick will look into drafting a policy/budget. Each Chief should compile their list of gear/PPE.
- Bob Kick passed out a packing comprised of Old SOG's, re-written SOGs, and several SOGs that could be deleted. He asked that all the commissioners review them for the month and come back at the September Meeting to vote on the changes and deletions.
- Radio & Hydrant Committee: None
- Truck Committee: Tim Whelan reported that the DOT and Pumps at Tracey's are wrapping up.

  He also reminded the Commissioner and Chiefs that if they are having any concerns with their vehicles to please let him know.

  Hawleyville ladder truck is budgeted to have yearly ladder testing.
- Budget Committee: Jay announced that he will be emailing the 20/21 Budget Template to the Chiefs and would like the budgets back by October 1, 2019
- NUSAR Chief McCarthy stated there is an issue when NUSAR is dispatched. Spotted Dog
  messaging being longwinded and contained too much information as to what the requested operation
  NUSAR was dispatched for! He is waiting to find a resolution to this issue.

**Hawleyville Tanker-** Tim Whalen spoke and after much discussion he made a motion to accept the BOFC Truck Committee recommendation as such.

"The board of fire Commissioners Truck Committee recommends that the Town of Newtown put the Hawleyville Tanker 339 out to public bid using the existing Guys Tanker Specification. The only change to this specification would be that the truck would be a four (4) man cab instead of a two (2) man Cab".
