The Board of Selectmen held a regular meeting Monday, March 19, 2018, in the Council Chamber, Newtown Municipal Center, 3 Primrose Street, Newtown. First Selectman Rosenthal called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m.

PRESENT: First Selectman Daniel C. Rosenthal, Selectman Maureen Crick Owen and Selectman Jeff Capeci.

ALSO PRESENT: Kimberly Chiapetta, two member of the press.

VOTER COMMENTS: none.

ACCEPTANCE OF THE MINUTES: <u>Selectman Capeci moved to accept the minutes of 03/05/18.</u> Selectmen Crick Owen seconded. All in favor.

COMMUNICATIONS: First Selectman Rosenthal shared the most recent storm report (att.), saying we remain within budget but recent storms have brought to total closer to exceeding budget. Newtown has been ranked in the top 100 safest communities in the United States.

FINANCE DIRECTORS REPORT: none.

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion and possible action:

- 1. Business Advisory Committee: The thought behind this is to give businesses an opportunity to share ideas and thoughts with local government; ways to make the business climate in town friendlier, to retain business as well as recruit new business. Many businesses in the community are members of peer groups with businesses outside of Newtown and hear creative ideas that can be shared with local government. Selectman Crick Owen moved to approve the Newtown Business Advisory Committee as outlined in the language provided (att.). Selectman Capeci seconded. Selectman Crick Owen suggested adding 'or designees(s)' to the portion relative to local newspaper(s). Selectman Capeci asked if the Economic Development Commission reviewed the language. Selectman Rosenthal spoke with both the EDC and the Chamber of Commerce and received positive feedback. Selectman Capeci suggested language change relative to members being appointed to serve. The committee will provide non-binding information. The success will be dependent on how willing local government is to incorporate ideas. If there is a nice synergy between the committee and local government there will be consideration given to establishing a commission. Non-voting members can participate; this is to be a local business driven effort. All in favor.
- 2. Certified Resolution: Selectman Crick Owen moved to approve the certified resolution for the Brownfield Area-Wide Revitalization Planning Grant: Be it resolved by the Board of Selectman 1.) That it is cognizant of the conditions and prerequisites (including the match obligations) for the state financial assistance imposed by C.G.S Section 32-763 and the Guidelines of the BAR Planning Program; 2.) That the filing of an application for State financial assistance by the Town of Newtown in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 is hereby approved and that Daniel Rosenthal, First Selectman, is directed to execute and file such application with the Connecticut Department of Economic and Community Development, to provide such additional information, to execute such other documents as may be required, to execute an Assistance Agreement with the State of Connecticut for State financial assistance if such an agreement is offered, to execute any amendments, decisions, and revisions thereto, and to act as the authorized representative of the Town of Newtown. 3.) That is agrees to fulfill the

required 10% cash match of the BAR Planning Grant Program if the application in successful. Selectman Capeci seconded. Ms. Chiapetta was present to explain that the office of Economic & Community Development is working with Naugatuck Valley COG to apply for the grant. The requested use is to obtain engineer drawings of the Fairfield Hills campus infrastructure and other documents necessary for an infrastructure upgrade project. Selectman Capeci asked if would obligate the town to anything other than the match requirement. Ms. Chiapetta will inquire with Naugatuck Valley COG. All in favor.

- 3. HART Grant Assignment Certification: Selectman Crick Owen moved to authorize Daniel Rosenthal to sign the grant assignment certification of the State of Connecticut 13b-38bb Elderly and Disabled Demand Responsive Municipal Grant Program through the Housatonic Area Regional Transit District. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 4. Appointments/Reappointments/Vacancies/Openings: Selectman Crick Owen moved the reappointment of Michelle Rosenthal to the Hattertown Historic District for a term to expire 06/30/22. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 5. Driveway Bond Release/Extension: none.
- 6. Tax Refunds: Selectman Crick Owen moved to revise the February 2018, refunds, Refund No. 14 from \$29,483.61 TO \$29,480.61. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor. Selectman Crick Owen moved the March 2018 Refunds, Refund No. 17, 2017/18 in the amount of \$113,324.97. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor. Selectman Crick Owen moved the April 2018 Refunds, Refund No. 18, 2017/2018 in the amount of \$79,827.94. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.

Newtown Business Advisory Committee

1. Summary of General Responsibilities: The Newtown Business Advisory Committee shall exist to provide recommendations and guidance to the Board of Selectmen on ways Newtown can improve its business climate. As such, the Committee may suggest revisions to policies and regulations with the objective being to retain and attract businesses to Newtown. Notwithstanding the above, the Committee is established pursuant to Section 2-115(e) of the Newtown Charter, and all actions thereof shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen.

2. Memberships and Terms:

VOTING MEMBERS: The Newtown Business Advisory Committee shall be representative of the town's business diversity and be comprised of not more than 9 members. No business sector shall be represented by more than 3 members and no individual business shall be represented by more than 1 member. All members must represent businesses located in the Town of Newtown.

NON-VOTING MEMBERS: Chairman or designee from Economic Development Commission, President or designee of Newtown Chamber of Commerce and Business Editor(s), or designee(s) from local newspaper(s).

All members shall be approved and serve at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen.

Meetings shall be held at least quarterly with periodic updates provided to the Board of Selectmen.

Subject to the provisions stated above, the Committee is empowered to appoint ad hoc committees to assist with special projects.
