VOTER COMMENTS: Louise Zierzow, Sandy Hook – Ms. Zierzow inquired about plans to repair the parking lot/sidewalks at the Senior Center. Ms. Place replied that there is a work order in for the sidewalk, over the years potholes have been addressed. MR. GUIDERA MOVED TO DRAFT A LETTER TO PUBLIC WORKS WITH A CC TO THE FIRST SELECTMAN TO INQUIRE ABOUT THE PARKING LOT. SECOND BY MS. ROTHSTEIN. ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION PASSES. (6-0)

COA Chair Report for September

Work continues on suggestions for new programs. The Subcommittee is working on ideas, helping to find new teachers. Looking at in-house talent both on the COA and within the current membership of the Senior Center.

I did contact several bakeries (someone even dropped off anonymously, to me 4 loaves of bread from Trader Joe's. I didn't contact Trader Joe's, so whoever this came from, THANK YOU!). Suzette, at the Health Department sent a list of items that needed to be addressed and answered before they give us their blessing. I printed it out the email and dropped it off to Marilyn. Here's what was asked:

Hi Anna,

As a follow up to our phone conversation earlier today, below are questions regarding offering bread at Newtown Senior Center:

- 1. How will items be protected during delivery from licensed food service establishments to NSC?
- 2. Who will transport food?
- 3. Are items offered, non-potentially hazardous (not requiring refrigeration)?
- 4. Once delivered, how will baked goods be stored?
- 5. Do you intend to date the items offered use by date?
- 6. Who will monitor when items are to be discarded?

I will meet with Marilyn to see what type of reports the new system can generate. Not having come with a booklet, it is challenging to navigate if you are unfamiliar with this type of program. The company has a wonderful support group. But we need a better idea from our members as to what they'd like to see in a report. Then we can look at our options and bring those to the meetings.

About 15 years ago (maybe even longer), there was a wonderful program that came out of the Senior Center that was done at the High School in the auditorium. It was about laughter. Something we ALL need more of. I hope you sign up and join me on Friday, September 28 at 12:00 for a program called Laugh for the Health of It Part II.

Attached also is my letter for the Resource Guide. Please take a look (I added a small paragraph at the end for the updated booklet) and let me know what changes, additions or deletions I need to make.

Program Statistics

Energy Assistance Applications – 2018-2019 (26 applications – 18 Senior/Disabled = 70%) Food Pantry (56 individuals/families visit weekly – 39 Senior/Disabled = 69%) Operation Fuel (Summer/Fall) – (8 applications – total \$3,248.67) Salvation Army – (43 applications to date - \$14,526.69 total – 20 Senior/Disabled = 46%) Renter's Rebate for 2017 – 67 applications to date

- Attended CHOICES update training to prepare for the upcoming Open Enrollment Period which begins October 15th through December 1st.
- Continuing to work with a 45 year disabled woman to get services in place for her at home. She is on the PCA (Personal Care Assistant) Waiver wait list which is still processing applications from 2015. Have applied to Medicaid and Community First Choice in the hope of getting some home care for her while waiting for PCA Waiver.
- Exploring the possibility of working with Habitat for Humanity on their "Brush With Kindness Program For Low Income Seniors". Eligible seniors can apply for home repair projects (\$250 to \$2500). At the discretion of Habitat, the homeowner will be asked to participate in the work to be done and/or will repair Habitat for cost of project in monthly installments.
- Working with a resident of Athena (formerly Masonicare/Lockwood Lodge) who has exhausted her long term care insurance benefit. We will be applying to Title 19 and are hoping she will be able to stay at Athena.
