Minutes – C. Theune moved to approve the minutes of the November 15, 2021 meeting, B. Bloom seconded with the correction that Lia Levitt was NOT absent and present via teleconference. All in favor with the correction.

Chair Report – A. Rothstein thanked everyone for their work on behalf of Newtown Seniors and looked forward to the coming year as they work together to continue to serve those who use the services and attend programs.

OLD BUSINESS

Update on Transportation Survey – N. Jackson reported that they received 427 through Survey Monkey and 50+ paper surveys. N. Simpson is working on putting the paper surveys in and then WestCOG will work to analyze the data.

Election of Officers – The nominating committee proposed Anne Rothstein for Chair, Barbara Bloom for Vice Chair and Larry Passaro for Treasurer. No other nominations were made. C.

Theune moved to have Anne Rothstein for Chair, Barbara Bloom for Vice Chair and Larry Passaro for Treasurer. J. Albanesi seconded, all in favor.

NEW BUSINESS

Cooperative Project with SC and CC – The Community Center would like to have a pottery class available to members of the senior center. The class would be for about 10 people. The Community Center is looking for a contribution from the COA gift fund in the amount of \$225 to cover the materials for the class. There will still be a \$20 charge to seniors for a 6 to 8 week course. B. Bloom moved to contribute \$225 for materials for the pottery class, L. Passaro second, all in favor.

Discussion and action for replacement of TV in Multipurpose room – The TV that is there now is too small. They do a lot of presentations and they are using the TV for their presentation. They would like to get an 85" TV to replace it and move the smaller one to the other side of the room for the pool players to enjoy. L. Passaro moved to authorize up to \$2500 for the purchase and installation of the new TV as well as moving the smaller TV in the multipurpose room. J. Albanesi seconded, all in favor.

Approval of meeting dates for 2022 – L. Passaro moved to approve the meeting schedule for 2022 (Attachment C). J. Albanesi seconded, all in favor.

 $Member\ comments$ – C. Symes was not at the meeting due to an illness. A. Rothstein wished him a speedy recovery and thanked him for his service to the seniors.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:35pm.

Commission on Aging Report: December 20, 2021

Dear Members of the COA,

The last few weeks in Human Services have been busy as we wrapped up the holiday programs for our residents in need this year. In partnership with the Newtown Fund, 92 households received holiday gifts and aid this season. In light of the ongoing pandemic, gifts were again delivered directly to recipients from donors in lieu of the traditional "depot day". While we miss some of the magic of the traditions that have long stood we are grateful through our partnerships that the giving continues and we have not faltered in being able to meet needs in our community.

This month we were also able to have the annual Craft Boutique return to the Senior Center. Through the incredible hard work, talent, and dedication of the Senior Center Crafters over \$5,000 was raised this year for the COA Gift Fund. The Crafters spent countless hours creating & crafting and then staffing numerous "Pop-up Boutiques" at the Community Center, the full day Senior Center Boutique on December 4th, and the Holiday Open house at the Center on the 10th.

Additional key updates to highlight include:

Transportation: the survey launched at the end of October to assess the transportation needs of our community's seniors was extended to mid-December. At close we had 472 surveys entered online through Survey Monkey and are now in process of entering the data from 50+ paper responses into the system. WestCOG will then be working to analyze the data. I look forward to continuing to report out on the results and discussions around next steps as the information evolves. In other news, I am thrilled to report that Newtown was awarded one of the very competitive 5310 grants for a new 10 passenger, 2 wheelchair places van. More to come on the timing. Thank you to John Boccuzzi from FONS for his work on the grant with me, and HARTransportation for their consult.

Lunch Program: The congregate meal program has continued over this month, two days a week. The Senior Center has continued to cover the cost of the meals for 12 members per day as we are in the final stages of finalizing the Memorandum of Understanding with Whitsons, the meal provider, WCAAA, and CW Resources. We hope to have meals back at full capacity, 4 days a week by end of January, following the next WCAAA Board Meeting. We will be pausing meals in January until the funding is in place.

A facilities update: Our facilities manager continues to work to secure an electrician and plumber for the dishwasher installation. As soon as those contractors are secured we are ready to order the dishwasher. The dishes purchased through the COA have been delivered.

Energy Assistance applications continue. Residents who qualify for this aid can reach out to Jackie or Alyssa at 203-270-4330 to complete their application. Finally, the Salvation Army had 2 consecutively successful bell ringing weekends, December 10, 11, 17, & 18, despite some cold and wet weather! The generosity of Newtown, neighbors helping neighbors, is always a special thing to be a part of this time of year.

I want to wish you all a very happy holiday. However you celebrate I hope it includes peace and good health!
