B. Bloom moved to add to the agenda discussion and possible action, making the Senior Center crafters boutiques year round by putting them on-line. L. Passaro seconded, all in favor.

**Public Comments** – Assistant Director of CH Booth Library Jennifer Nash shared a few up coming events with the commission (attachment A). One is a Memory Café which will be held the first Monday of the month and Caregiver Success which will be held Thursday March 10 both in person and on-line.

Minutes – B. Bloom moved to approve the minutes of the January 24, 2022 meeting. J. Albanesi seconded, all in favor.

Chair Report – No report

Vice Chair Report – No report

**Director of Human Services** – Reviewed her report (attachment B). N. Jackson explained that they did get an award from DOT for a 10 passenger bus and hoped to have it by spring but they are not anticipating delivery for 12 to 15 months.

**Treasurer's Report** (attachment C)— L. Passaro explained that the supplies for the ceramic class was \$25 more than expected. B. Bloom moved to approve an additional \$25 for ceramic class supplies. J. Albanesi seconded, all in favor.

B. Bloom moved to approve the Treasurer's report for audit. A. Rothstein seconded, all in favor.

**First Selectman Dan Rosenthal** – First Selectman Rosenthal reported that there are requests for ARP funds that are being considered for a larger Senior bus that would be shared with the

Community Center as well, door openers for heavy the doors and address the long standing wifi issue in the building.

#### OLD BUSINESS

Follow-up on Handicapped Adaptions for Senior Center - N. Jackson reported that they put them on the request list for ARP. They also discussed doing railing, what they have discovered is that the placement is more important than what they put up.

Follow-up on Discussion of Handicap access at Senior Center – N. Jackson reported that the price tag is much larger than they anticipated so they are going to add it to the ARP funding, not from the gift fund.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

COA Contribution to Meal Plan – N. Jackson explained that they are going to start with the lunch program starting in March 2 times a week. There are some seniors experience hardships and can't pay the \$3. It would look very similar to other Social Service programs and the process would be completely confidential. After discussion it was decided to use the previously approved funds for Senior lunches to subsize the lunches. A. Rothstein moved to use the \$201.87 in the lunch balance to subsidize seniors who need meal assistance. L. Passaro seconded, all in favor.

Livable Community – A. Rothstein explained that John Boccuzzi from FONs would like FONs and COA to join together to submit a grant due March 22. A. Rothstein will work with J. Bocuzzi to figure out what they are going ask for.

Making the Senior Center Crafters Boutiques Year Round by Putting Them On-Line – L. Frampton has asked to consider making the senior craft project to be year round. The Women's Club of Newtown sells their ornaments on-line which may be good for the senior crafters as well to make it available year round. It was discussed that L. Frampton will schedule a discussion with the crafters through N. Jackson.

Member Comments – Judit Destefano and Bill Darrin introduced themselves. They are both new members.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:48pm.





A Memory Café is a welcoming place for people with changes in their memory and their care-partner(s) to come together.



Thursday, March 10 at 6:30 pm Online or in the Gathering Room



Commission on Aging Report: February 28, 2022

Hello Members of the COA,

THANK YOU, thank you COA for your support of the Senior Center and senior activities over the last month. The senior pottery class at the Community Center, subsidized by COA, has begun and is being thoroughly enjoyed by 13 members. The class filled in one day of enrollment opening. With the COA's support the Senior Center's new upgrades include the new 85 inch TV mounted in the multipurpose room and the beautiful framed scenes from around Newtown being hung down the hallways. Finally, on February 11<sup>th</sup>, 40 members enjoyed the Valentines *Party Hearty* with live entertainment and a delicious meal, which was funded through the Commission. It's been really nice to be able to offer new programming and brighten up the Center during these cold winter days. In March we are looking forward to continuing the winter fun at the Senior Center with our Mardi Gras and St. Patrick's Day parties!

We are thrilled to see so many members in the facility each day, enjoying classes and events. New members continue to join us. To date we have 639 members, which includes 225 first time memberships and 33 memberships just last month! With the coming of the warmer weather we are looking forward to bringing tours back. There are 3 tours planned for April, May and June. The destinations include the Clock Museum, a Thimble Island Cruise, and a lighthouse cruise. We expect that the new 10-passenger bus, awarded through the DOT 5310 grant, will be here in time to kick off the return of our day tours. The transportation committee looks forward to sharing the results of the survey and discussing next steps at the March COA meeting.

This coming month we will be restarting the meal program with Whitsons. We expect the grant funding will be in place for April so in March Human Services will be subsidizing the cost of the meals. Meals will be provided Tuesdays and Thursdays for the month of March, at a minimal cost of \$3 per meal for members. At today's meeting I would like to explore the possibility of COA helping to cover the cost of meals should there be a senior experiencing financial hardship, making the meal cost prohibitive of them participating. Like with all financial assistance granted through Human Services need will be validated and aid will be provided confidentially.
