Commission on Aging Report: May 16, 2022

Hello Members of the COA,

On behalf of the Human Services team and the Town I would like to extend our deepest condolences to Ruby Ryles' family. Ruby's obituary can be read here, https://www.newtownbee.com/05102022/ruby-l-ryles-martin/. She was a woman of incredible accomplishments and passion. I know her presence on the COA will be very missed.

HUMAN SERVICES AID & PROGRAMS

Energy Assistance: The EA benefit deadline was extended this year through the month of May. With the increased cost of energy this is helpful to many residents who had applied and qualified for the aid. This season the Department completed 152 applications, an increase of over 30 from the prior year. In addition to being able to complete the application through our Town office residents do also have the ability to complete their application at Community Action in Danbury. As a result we do not have the complete number of households receiving the benefit this year, but it is clear to see that with increasing costs and the impacts of COVID usage of the program has increased.

Renters Rebate: The 2022 program opened on April 1st. CT State law provides a reimbursement program for renters who are 65+ or totally disabled, and whose incomes do not exceed certain limits. Persons renting an apartment or room, or living in cooperative housing or a mobile home may be eligible. Last year the Department completed 81 applications. This year 21 have been completed to date. The program runs from April through October.

As we are seeing rising costs across the board requests for financial assistance are increasing. DHS appreciates the support of numerous community partners, including the Newtown Fund and the Salvation Army. Their aid continues to allow us to help those most in need.

SENIOR CENTER UPDATES:

Memberships: Our total number of members for the 22/23 year is 693, 294 of which were first time members. We have begun our membership campaign for the 23/24 year. Any brand-new member coming in at this point receives the remainder of this year, in addition to their year membership from July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023. We already have 17 first time members registered for the 23/24 year.

Meal Program: The grant funding to allow us subsidize to cost of the meal program for members officially began May 1. With this funding the \$8.00 meal is only a \$3.00 cost to members. In May we increased our reservation capacity to 15 and have "sold out" every meal. We will continue to grow the program in size and days in the coming months. The feedback on the quality and taste of the meals have been overwhelmingly positive. We believe that despite the challenges that going "off the beaten path" to establish a new program presented it was well worth the wait!

Facility Update: The dishwasher has been delivered and installation has begun (it requires some plumbing and electrical work but is underway)! We are looking forward to being able to use the dishware that a donation to COA allowed us to purchase. The dishwasher will allow us to meet health code for sanitizing so we can get rid of the paper plates and plastic utensils for our meal program.

ARP Money to Newtown: There have been some exciting approvals for us for the American Rescue Plan funds. The committee approved \$16K for the installation of handicap buttons for three doors in the Senior Center and \$90K for the replacement of the 16-passenger van. More to come on the timing of these!
