Minutes – <u>L. Frampton moved to approve the minutes of the May 16, 2022 meeting.</u> C. Theune seconded, all in favor.

Table at Arts Festival – L. Frampton moved to participate in the Arts Festival, Claire seconded, all in favor. L. Passaro explained that there is confusion that Friends of Newtown Seniors (FONS) is part of the commission on aging. He expressed concern that sharing a table at the

Arts Festival will foster that confusion. B. Bloom explained that these are three separate entities all advocating for seniors.

L. Frampton amended her motion that the COA and Senior Center should have their own table next to FONS. L. Passaro seconded motion passes 7 Yes (Han, Frampton, Gogliettino, Levitt, Passaro, Rothstein, Theune) to 2 No (Bloom, Camporeale). The commission stressed the importance of working together for the seniors but not blurring the town/nonprofit line. They appreciate all that FONS does.

Commission on Aging Report: June 20, 2022

Its membership time at the Senior Center. We have begun our membership campaign for the 23/24 year. We already have 49 first time members registered for the 23/24 year! This year members receive the new handbook along with information about the Senior Center and local resources in a welcome packet.

I'm happy to report our Center is bustling- programs and classes are full and tours are selling out. We are looking forward to a busy summer. A few upcoming highlights include: local therapist, Robert Schmidt coming to talk about his recent book and *Finding Happiness Through Resilience*, AARP returning to the Center for their Smart Driver course for the first time since COVID, and a summer party at Dickenson Park in partnership with Parks & Recreation.

Our meal program is experiencing a brief hiccup. The Newtown Senior Center and Whitsons Culinary Group meal program was a huge success for May, but has ended in June. Unfortunately, Whitsons who was contracted to serve Newtown through the BOE did not receive the contract for the coming year. We are looking forward to connecting with the new meal provider and hope the program will restart with their partnership in the fall. In the interim we have had and will continue to have some special lunches brought to us by the Community Center and the Better Day Café. The Senior Center will also host several lunches for members over the summer months.

Human Services support to residents in need continues to be at a heightened level. With assistance from community partners and neighboring agencies we continue efforts to meet those needs and connect households to longer term supports where needed. The Department continues to process Renters Rebate applications. CT State law provides a reimbursement program for renters who are 65+ or totally disabled, and whose incomes do not exceed certain limits. Persons renting an apartment or room, or living in cooperative housing or a mobile home may be eligible. This program runs through October.
