Commission on Aging Report: February 27, 2023

Hello Members of the COA.

While the snow may finally be coming our way this week, the Department of Human Services is already springing forward! We have begun planning for the return of our *Spring Fling* in partnership with Parks & Recreation and we are looking for new and creative ways to kick on the 23/24 membership year at the Senior Center.

Following up on two important areas from last month's meeting and report:

Senior Center Meal Program:

The congregate meal program, with new partner Nick's Catering, has been a great success thus far. The Memorandum of Understanding between WCAAA, CW Solutions and Newtown was approved and signed by all parties at the start of February.

With the new MOU in place we are able to keep the diner cost to only \$5, with the reminder subsidized by the WCAAA grant. The total price per meal is approximately \$10, including supplies. Currently meals are offered Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. Allowing Thursdays and Fridays to be open for special events and Lunch and Learn presentations. Senior Center staff continue to pick up the food, manage lunch reservations and check-in, and serve. Unfortunately we may be facing some changes in the program in the coming months due to limits in the grant funding. This may look like less reservations available or a decrease in days we can serve. We are working with area Senior Centers and will be advocating with the partners involved in hopes to keep our numbers as close to what we have built since beginning with Nicks. I will continue to update the COA on this.

ARPA Funds:

As reported last month the Department of Human Services has been very fortunate to receive some of the American Rescue Plan Funds to assist in these areas:

- Housing Stabilization
- ALICE Enrichment Funds
- Tutoring Services
- Transportation- replacement of the 16 passenger van to be shared with the Community Center

The exciting updates in this area include the estimated arrival of the bus to now be summer and the tutoring program inquires now rolling in—thanks to the support of the BOE.

*additional note- the smaller 10-passenger van awarded to Newtown through the DOT 5310 grant does not have an expected arrival date. While the initial delivery date was spring of 2022, the current chip shortage has impacted delivery and to date there is not a new estimate for arrival.

While spring may be on the mind of many of us, in all seriousness the winter is not yet behind us and energy costs are a concern. Operation Fuel, a program that provides emergency assistance, is putting a pause on the program for March after a significant demand for energy assistance this year. It will also be reducing the amount of assistance it provides so that it can help more families.

The nonprofit organization said it will resume providing energy assistance on April 3, but will reduce energy grants from \$1,000 per household to \$500, to serve more households. A news release from Operation Fuel said it has provided nearly \$6 million in energy assistance to more than 6,000 households. Operation Fuel said it will provide energy assistance from April 3 through

May 31, or whenever funds run out, whichever is first. Operation Fuel is an important resource that can be accessed after a resident uses all of their Energy Assistance benefit through Community Action. With Operation Fuel on hold in March DHS expects to see an increase in requests for assistance to our office/the Town. We will continue to work to meet the needs as best we can, as always with the help and generosity of our charitable community partners.
