Updates for the Newtown Senior Center

The Newtown Senior Center is thrilled to share breaking news with the COA.... next month we will be moving to online registrations for our classes and all events. With increasing membership and programming this will streamline the registration process and allow members to have more control over their event calendar. Through the database we already use, My Senior Center, we have the capacity for members to create their own logins and manage their calendar. We will be setting up helpdesk stations throughout the month to help members sign up and get used to the program. The staff have been in system getting used to the functions and we all agree it's extremely user friendly. And of course staff will continue to be able to help members at the front desk while at the Center and by phone for reservations.

After research of our surrounding areas and much consideration we are also looking to make some changes to the fee schedule in the coming FY. While we are still in the planning phase we are moving toward a nominal fee for our Health & Wellness classes. Residents will receive several classes a week included in their membership, with additional classes then being \$3.00. Out of town members will pay the fee per class. For this FY no changes to the \$20 resident, \$25 nonresident annual membership fee will be made. We are working with Finance Department and the software company to work out the many details involved and we certainly would appreciate any feedback from the COA regarding this proposed direction. Including a fee as area Centers do will allow us to add several more classes and increase instructor rates, while freeing more funds to increase the diversity of programming and events throughout the Center.

Please save the date for the return of the Senior Spring Fling—May 19th at the Newtown High School. We are thrilled to once again be gearing up for this great event in partnership with Parks & Recreation!

Social Service Programs & Updates

Human Services is working with our partners under the VOCA (Victims of Crime Act) grant to prepare for the upcoming audit in May. VOCA funding allows the Town, BOE, and partner agencies, RCN and the SHNF to provide many of the 12/14 specific services to the community. While this coming year will be the last year the Town is seeking this grant services through Human Services and the schools will continue. In February the Resiliency Center of Newtown (RCN) announced that "after a decade after opening to help address the impacts of the worst community tragedy Newtown has ever faced, the Resiliency Center of Newtown (RCN) will conclude its mission of service to the Newtown community effective June 30. Financial support for those most impacted by the events of 12/14 will remain available through The Sandy Hook School Support Fund". Human Services will be looking to provide any support needed to RCN and its clients during this transition.

The Renter's Rebate program is now open. Applications for this reimbursement program for Connecticut renters who are elderly or totally disabled, may be completed with our Department through October 1st.
