Commission on Aging Report: July 17, 2023

Greetings members of the COA,

I am looking forward to welcoming Michelle Puzzo, Executive Director of UR Community Cares to our meeting today. As I shared last month when proposing she join us to present information about the agency and the work, UR COMMUNITY CARES helps fill in the gaps of traditional at-home care services by mobilizing residents to care about and connect with each other. Their goal is to link people who can help to those who need help. Using their secure website, interested Volunteers and Community Members are connected. To help ensure safety and security, all Volunteers and Community Members are enrolled via the website and must pass a background check. Tasks can range from respite care to relocation packing and moving, smartphone or other device assistance, and much more. I'm looking forward to hearing more from Michelle and learning how this might be an opportunity for Newtown.

This Thursday we are hosting our first Senior Center *Open House and Health and Wellness Expo*. The Senior Center is thrilled to partner with the Newtown Health District to host a health fair geared specifically toward our senior residents. The event is free to all visitors. Vendors will be located throughout the Center with special events and demonstrations between 10:00 am and 1:00 pm.

While visitors gather information from the various vendors and professionals located throughout the Center, they will enjoy live music by "The Acoustic Duo" Bob & Josie Schmidt as well as piano performances by Zackary Macey. Special attractions include: Nicks Catering who provides lunches at the Newtown Senior Center offering prepared meals to go for sale, Senior Center exercise instructors providing thirty-minute demonstrations of some of the Center's most popular classes (including Deep Stretch at 10:15, Broadway Burn at 11:00, Chair Yoga & Meditation at 11:45 and MELT at 12:30), an eye care for seniors presentation by Dr. Young at 11:00, blood pressure checks with our Community Nurse, Joan Santucci, as well as games and giveaway. Vendors will include: Nuvance Health Care, Hartford Health Care, The NYA, Coastal Hearing, the Newtown Health District, Church Hill Village, resources for suicide prevention, Kindred Spirits, the Newtown Ambulance, Friends of Newtown Seniors (FONS), Regenerative Works, Stern At-home Therapy, Edward Jones, TLC Senior Living, the Newtown Community Center and Parks & Recreation, and many more. We hope this proves to be a success and becomes an annual event.

The new membership year began July 1. So far we have 309 residents and 58 non-resident new or renewed memberships already signed up by mid-July. As folks come in they are alerted when scanning if they need to renew. We are hoping the Open House brings in new first time members to the Center. July 1 also began our online payment system. The transition to online sign-ups and payments has gone very smoothly. Signing up is easy at myactivecenter.com!

Get to know us

UR Community Cares provides a secure website that connects older adults and people with physical disabilities to community-based volunteer support to help them live safely at home. Athome services are offered free of charge, including household chores, yard work, companionship including pick-up/delivery of groceries/pet care, and local transportation (subject to volunteer availability).

Our online match-up system at <u>URCommunityCares.org</u> is a collaborative, self-generating, and self-sustaining solution for interested communities and organizations. People age 70+ and/or 18+ with a permanent or temporary physical disability comprise roughly one-third of every town's population. This sector is growing in size in many towns, presenting new challenges for social services and public safety. Local residents can work together to assist neighbors and help them overcome risks of falling, mobility restrictions, isolation, and loneliness.

We rely on funding such as donations, sponsorships, grants, and municipal budget allocations. Our estimated per-participant annualized cost is \$100/person. This must be addressed in advance in order for us to cover direct program costs (i.e., background checking, website security/software, admin., marketing, operational expenses and insurance coverage). Our goal is to offer services at no charge to participants. Contributions to our 501(c)(3) nonprofit are tax-deductible.


To participate, community members will enroll online, can be signed up by a partner or call 860-430-4557, then undergo a background check and then once approved request assistance from the volunteers in town. Volunteers undergo the same sign-up process and then will accept service requests whenever they can (eligibility starts at age 15 and adult consent/supervision is required for 15-17 year olds). Volunteers decide their schedule and the category they are interested in helping in.

Guided by our Executive Director, our participation criteria have no restrictions in terms of income, assets, benefits status, race, ethnicity, gender, religion, or sexual orientation.
