CALL TO ORDER: K. Alexander called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:30pm.

VOTER COMMENT: None

MINUTES: J. Bloom moved to approve the minutes of the 12/6/23 meeting, Derek Pisani seconded, all in favor.

COMMUNICATIONS: K. Alexander explained to the emails the commission receives from the town website go to all the members. It is best that any replies from members filter through the chair so that the person emailing will get one response. At the last meeting it was questioned why the Board of Education was not present for their transfer and K. Alexander explained it was an oversite with the new BOE Chair. In the future they will be at any meeting they are requested to be at. Newtown POCD met with a number of people, last Friday, who discussed the POCD which is a 10 year plan. In April of 2024 they would like to have a plan. They have sent a questionnaire out that they would like everyone to fill out by 12/31/23. T. Long expressed concern that with a short time frame, they will push it through for approval without much time to review.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: K. Alexander provided committee assignments (att.).

FIRST SELECTMAN'S REPORT: First Selectman Capeci reported that the Finance Director is starting to compile the 24/25 budgets from departments. Public Building and Site is finishing up two major projects, Hawley School and Sandy Hook Permeant Memorial and beginning work on CH Booth Library. He met with DOT about the paving on Route 34. They replaced the storm drains and resurfaced the road to give it another 10 years of life. The radio digital migration continues with bi-weekly meetings and a punch list of items that still needs to be addressed. They are looking to sell the old Police Department, 3 Main Street and he has requested an appraisal. Sunday night's storm was very disruptive. There was over 6300 homes without power. 5700 were restored in 12 hours. A large number of roads were impacted by the storm as well.

NEW BUSINESS

2024-25 to 2028-28 CIP – Ross Carley, Chair of the FFH Authority explained that the CIP is a backup plan should they not get on the historic designation they applied for. In January they will get their notification about historic designation for the campus which would create a 30% tax credit for any development. They have a developer, who is very familiar with the processes, guiding the FFH Authority through it. If they receive the historic designation they cannot demolish a building for 8 years

unless there is a safety issue. In that time the idea is that a developer will be attracted to the 30% tax credit and develop rather than demolish.

2024 Meeting Calendar – J. Bloom moved to approve the 2024 meeting calendar, L. Miller seconded. It was discussed to change the June 19 meeting to June 26, the October 2 meeting to October 9 and the October 16 meeting to October 23. J. Bloom moved to amend the motion with corrections. H. Dean seconded, all in favor of the amended motion.
