The Commission on Aging (COA) was created in 1979 through an ordinance adopted by Newtown's Legislative Council. Its purpose is to:

- study the needs of Newtown's Senior residents and coordinate programs for them;
- make applications for grants, along with the Director of Senior Services, to governmental agencies and prepare opinions on the merits of programs for which grants are proposed; and,
- act as an agent for other Federal, State or town boards, commissions, agencies or local private groups to carry out programs for Newtown Seniors as authorized by such entities.

The COA places primary emphasis on the needs of persons 55 years or older. The Commissioners both sponsor and conduct a number of senior related activities such as surveys, outreach and community events. We have made our presence known to other boards and commissions as well as the various 55 and over residential homes.

We look forward to welcoming you all to the Senior Center on Simpson Street adjacent to the Community Center We will have more space, a greatly expanded program of inviting and exciting activities and additional opportunities for socializing with friends.

I am proud to serve on the COA, with an outstanding board and invite you to attend one of our monthly meetings which take place the third Monday of each month at the Senior Center.

Message from the Director of Human Services

As Director of Human Services, I serve residents over the age of 60 and disabled residents over the age of 18 by disseminating information about available resources and providing assistance with applications for State and Federal programs.

These programs include: Medicare Part D for prescriptions; Medicare Savings Plan (QMB), Medicaid, Long-Term Medical Care/Home Care; and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

In addition, I administer the following programs: Connecticut Energy Assistance, Operation Fuel, Emergency Food Assistance, and Renters Rebate for the elderly (over age 60) and disabled over the age of 18.

I also direct The Newtown Senior Center, open to adults age 55 and over or disabled individuals. We are the focal point for senior services and link seniors and their families to resources offered through the Center and at other agencies.

There's a lot happening here! Our programming is designed to appeal to a wide variety of interests. You can take classes, join groups, exercise, listen to speakers, take advantage of seminars, health screenings, enjoy a day or overnight trip, attend special events and parties or simply socialize and make new friends.
