## THE FOLLOWING MINTUES RE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen held a regular meeting Monday, May17, 2021. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers at the Newtown Municipal Center. First Selectman Rosenthal called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT: First Selectman Daniel C. Rosenthal, Selectman Maureen Crick Owen and Selectman Jeff Capeci

**ALSO PRESENT:** Finance Director Robert Tait, Deputy Director of Planning Rob Sibley, Director of Planning George Benson and Economic Development Commission members Wes Thompson and Jeffrey Robinson, arrived at 8:15 p.m. for executive session.

**VOTER COMMENTS:** none.

ACCEPTANCE OF THE MINUTES: Selectman Crick Owen moved to accept the regular meeting minutes of May 3, 2021. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.

**COMMUNICATIONS:** It appears CT will adopt the same policy as the CDC recommends as far as mask wearing; local guidelines have not come out yet but according to the CDC there will be no sector rules as of May 19 and no masks required outdoors, unless in larger groups. Indoors mask will not be required for those fully vaccinated but will be required for those not vaccinated; this will be on the honor system. There will be an adjustment period. A zoom meeting with the Chamber of Commerce showed they are working with businesses and assessing next moves.

FINANCE DIRECTORS REPORT: The auditors will be in the office to start their interim audit. The Legislative Council will appoint the auditors, per Charter, on Wednesday. This is the fifth year of a five year contract. Departments will work on their 2022-23 CIP requests during June, July and August; mainly working on the 5<sup>th</sup> year. The Edmond Town Hall will be on the Town's financial accounting system on July 1, per the recommendation of the auditors. Mr. Tait reviewed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, updated 5/14/21 (att.).

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Discussion and possible action:

- 1. Lot Line Revision Recommendation: Rob Sibley presented the property on Walnut Tree Hill (att.). This property has a portion of Town property abutted and a portion of Al's Trail runs adjacent to the property. The property map has been modified a few times to help facilitate the trail. The property owner is willing to do an equal exchange. The Conservation Commission endorsed this along with an 8-24 recommendation from P&Z. Selectman Crick Owen moved to approve the lot line revision for 76A Walnut Tree Hill Road for .23 acreage equal exchange. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 2. Open Space Donation: Rob Sibley presented a parcel at 9 Beechwood Drive, for acquisition through donation (att.). The current owner of the property wishes to donate it to the Town. The value, per Charter, requires an appraisal to be done; the assessment has it valued over the maximum allowable value of \$20,000. This will go through the Board of Finance and the Legislative Council and has passed the Conservation Commission along with an 8-24 recommendation from P&Z. There is no open space that abuts this property. The 4.6 acres does not meet the criteria to build on; George Benson reported there have been attempts to develop the property. There are concentrated areas and public access. Selectman Crick Owen moved to accept the open space donation for 9 Beechwood Drive. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.

- 3. Resolution: First Selectman Rosenthal noted the last time the High School turf was replaced was in 2010. Selectman Crick Owen moved the resolution: RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$765,000 FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE NEWTOWN HIGH SCHOOL STADIUM TURF AS AUTHORIZED IN THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (2021-22 TO 2025-26) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$765,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID SPECIAL APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE and further moved to waive the reading of the entire resolution (att.). Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 4. Newsylum License Agreement: First Selectman Rosenthal said the brewery is looking to better define their property. The thought was that people would want to go inside to see the beautiful building; outdoor use wasn't considered; opening during COVID presented special challenges. There are no immediate plans for demo or renovation of Stamford. Newsylum plans to bring fencing to Stamford to use the wall for backdrop for live entertainment. The lease will not be modified; the license will give Newsylum additional space for the next year. Selectman Crick Owen moved to approve the License Agreement between the Town of Newtown and Newsylum Brewing Company as presented (att.). Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 5. Appointments/Reappointments/Vacancies/Openings: Selectman Crick Owen moved the appointments/reappointments of the Lake Lillinonah Officers & Assistants as presented per letter dated May 3, 2021 (att.). Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 6. Driveway Bond Release/Extension: Selectman Crick Owen moved the release of the following driveway bonds: Riverwalk Properties, Charlie's Circle, M38, B9, L59, in the amount of \$1,000; GRC Construction, LLC, Old Hawleyville Road, M5, B5, L6 in the amount of \$1,000; Rock Harbor Builders, LLC, Robin Hill Road, M14, B2, L4 in the amount of \$1,000; Bradford Joblin, Robin Hill Road, M19, B2, L4 in the amount of \$19,200. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 7. Tax Refunds: Selectman Crick Owen moved to approve Tax Refund #19 in the amount of \$601.97. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.
- 8. Tax Abatements: Selectman Crick Owen moved the Tax Abatements 2021 in the amount of \$2,216.22

**VOTER COMMENTS:** none.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: none.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Selectman Crick Owen moved to enter into executive session for the discussion of potential sale of Town property and to invite George Benson, Wes Thompson and Jeffrey Robinson. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor. Executive session was entered into at 8:18 p.m. and returned to regular session at 9:35 p.m. with the following motion:

Selectman Crick Owen moved to accept the recommendation of the Economic Development Commission and authorize the First Selectman to act on behalf of the Town to enter into negotiations for the sale of Town owned property to the developer designated as Nature Valley. Selectman Capeci seconded. All in favor.

**ADJOURNMENT:** Having no further business the regular Board of Selectmen meeting was adjourned at 9:40 p.m.



RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$765,000 FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE NEWTOWN HIGH SCHOOL STADIUM TURF AS AUTHORIZED IN THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (2021-22 TO 2025-26) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$765,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID SPECIAL APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE

#### RESOLVED:

Section 1. The sum of \$765,000 is a special appropriation made pursuant to Chapter 6, Section 6-35 of the Town Charter of the Town of Newtown (the "Town") for the planning, design, engineering, construction and replacement of the Newtown High School stadium turf, all as authorized in the Capital Improvement Plan (2021-22 to 2025-26), and for administrative, financing, legal and costs of issuance related thereto (collectively, the "Project"), said appropriation to be inclusive of any and all State, Federal or other grants-in-aid thereof.

Section 2. To meet said appropriation, \$765,000 bonds of the Town, or so much thereof as shall be necessary for such purpose, shall be issued, maturing not later than the maximum maturity permitted by the General Statutes of the State of Connecticut, Revision of 1958, as amended from time to time (the "Connecticut General Statutes"). The bonds may be issued in one or more series as determined by the Financial Director, and the amount of bonds of each series to be issued shall be fixed by the Financial Director, in the amount necessary to meet the Town's share of the cost of the Project determined after considering the estimated amount of State and Federal grants-in-aid of the Project, or the actual amount thereof if this be ascertainable, and the anticipated times of the receipt of the proceeds thereof, provided that the total amount of bonds to be issued shall not be less than an amount which will provide funds sufficient with other funds available for such purpose to pay the principal of and the interest on all temporary borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the bonds outstanding at the time of the issuance thereof, and to pay for the costs of issuance of such bonds. The bonds shall be in the denomination of \$1,000 or a whole multiple thereof, be issued in fully registered form, be executed in the name and on behalf of the Town by the facsimile or manual signatures of the First Selectman and the Financial Director, bear the Town seal or a facsimile thereof, be certified by a bank or trust company, which bank or trust company may be designated the registrar and transfer agent, be payable at a bank or trust company, and be approved as to their legality by Robinson & Cole LLP, Attorneys-at-Law, of Hartford, Connecticut. The bonds shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the bonds shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon. The aggregate principal amount of the bonds of each series to be issued, the annual installments of principal, redemption provisions, if any, the date, time of issue and sale and other terms, details and particulars of such bonds including approval of the rate or rates of interest shall be determined by the First Selectman and the Financial Director, in accordance with the Connecticut General Statutes.

Section 3. Said bonds shall be sold by the First Selectman and the Financial Director in a competitive offering and the bonds shall be sold at not less than par and accrued interest on the basis of the lowest net or true interest cost to the Town. To the extent required by the Charter of the Town of Newtown, bids shall be solicited from at least three lending institutions. A notice of sale or a summary thereof describing the bonds and setting forth the terms and conditions of the sale shall be published at least five days in advance of the sale in a recognized publication carrying municipal bond notices and devoted primarily to financial news and the subject of state and municipal bonds.

- The First Selectman and the Financial Director are authorized to make temporary Section 4. borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds. Notes evidencing such borrowings shall be signed by the First Selectman and the Financial Director, have the seal of the Town affixed, be payable at a bank or trust company designated by the First Selectman, be approved as to their legality by Robinson & Cole LLP, Attorneys-at-Law, of Hartford, Connecticut, and be certified by a bank or trust company designated by the First Selectman pursuant to Section 7-373 of the Connecticut General Statutes. They shall be issued with maturity dates which comply with the provisions of the Connecticut General Statutes governing the issuance of such notes, as the same may be amended from time to time. The notes shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the notes shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. The net interest cost on such notes, including renewals thereof, and the expense of preparing, issuing and marketing them, to the extent paid from the proceeds of such renewals or said bonds, shall be included as a cost of the Project. Upon the sale of the bonds, the proceeds thereof, to the extent required, shall be applied forthwith to the payment of the principal of and the interest on any such notes then outstanding or shall be deposited with a bank or trust company in trust for such purpose.
- Section 5. The First Selectman is authorized in the name and on behalf of the Town to apply for and accept any and all Federal and State loans and/or grants-in-aid of the Project and is further authorized to expend said funds in accordance with the terms hereof and in connection therewith, to contract in the name of the Town with engineers, contractors and others.
- Section 6. The Town hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and anytime after the date of passage of this resolution in the maximum amount and for the Project with the proceeds of bonds or bond anticipation notes or other obligations ("Tax-Exempt Obligations") authorized to be issued by the Town. The Tax-Exempt Obligations shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Project, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The Town hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Financial Director or his designee is authorized to pay Project expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of Tax-Exempt Obligations, and to amend this declaration.
- Section 7. Selectman Crick Owen introduced and read the following resolution:

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$765,000 FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE NEWTOWN HIGH SCHOOL STADIUM TURF AS AUTHORIZED IN THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (2021-22 TO 2025-26) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$765,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID SPECIAL APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE

#### **RESOLVED:**

Section 1. The sum of \$765,000 is a special appropriation made pursuant to Chapter 6, Section 6-35 of the Town Charter of the Town of Newtown (the "Town") for the planning, design, engineering, construction and replacement of the Newtown High School stadium turf, all as authorized in the Capital Improvement Plan (2021-22 to 2025-26), and for administrative, financing, legal and costs of issuance related thereto (collectively, the "Project"), said appropriation to be inclusive of any and all State, Federal or other grants-in-aid thereof.

Section 2. To meet said appropriation, \$765,000 bonds of the Town, or so much thereof as shall be necessary for such purpose, shall be issued, maturing not later than the maximum maturity permitted by the General Statutes of the State of Connecticut, Revision of 1958, as amended from time to time (the "Connecticut General Statutes"). The bonds may be issued in one or more series as determined by the Financial Director, and the amount of bonds of each series to be issued shall be fixed by the Financial Director, in the amount necessary to meet the Town's share of the cost of the Project determined after considering the estimated amount of State and Federal grants-in-aid of the Project, or the actual amount thereof if this be ascertainable, and the anticipated times of the receipt of the proceeds thereof, provided that the total amount of bonds to be issued shall not be less than an amount which will provide funds sufficient with other funds available for such purpose to pay the principal of and the interest on all temporary borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the bonds outstanding at the time of the issuance thereof, and to pay for the costs of issuance of such bonds. The bonds shall be in the denomination of \$1,000 or a whole multiple thereof, be issued in fully registered

form, be executed in the name and on behalf of the Town by the facsimile or manual signatures of the First Selectman and the Financial Director, bear the Town seal or a facsimile thereof, be certified by a bank or trust company, which bank or trust company may be designated the registrar and transfer agent, be payable at a bank or trust company, and be approved as to their legality by Robinson & Cole LLP, Attorneys-at-Law, of Hartford, Connecticut. The bonds shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the bonds shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon. The aggregate principal amount of the bonds of each series to be issued, the annual installments of principal, redemption provisions, if any, the date, time of issue and sale and other terms, details and particulars of such bonds including approval of the rate or rates of interest shall be determined by the First Selectman and the Financial Director, in accordance with the Connecticut General Statutes.

- Section 3. Said bonds shall be sold by the First Selectman and the Financial Director in a competitive offering and the bonds shall be sold at not less than par and accrued interest on the basis of the lowest net or true interest cost to the Town. To the extent required by the Charter of the Town of Newtown, bids shall be solicited from at least three lending institutions. A notice of sale or a summary thereof describing the bonds and setting forth the terms and conditions of the sale shall be published at least five days in advance of the sale in a recognized publication carrying municipal bond notices and devoted primarily to financial news and the subject of state and municipal bonds.
- The First Selectman and the Financial Director are authorized to make temporary Section 4. borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds. Notes evidencing such borrowings shall be signed by the First Selectman and the Financial Director, have the seal of the Town affixed, be payable at a bank or trust company designated by the First Selectman, be approved as to their legality by Robinson & Cole LLP, Attorneys-at-Law, of Hartford, Connecticut, and be certified by a bank or trust company designated by the First Selectman pursuant to Section 7-373 of the Connecticut General Statutes. They shall be issued with maturity dates which comply with the provisions of the Connecticut General Statutes governing the issuance of such notes, as the same may be amended from time to time. The notes shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the notes shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. The net interest cost on such notes, including renewals thereof, and the expense of preparing, issuing and marketing them, to the extent paid from the proceeds of such renewals or said bonds, shall be included as a cost of the Project. Upon the sale of the bonds, the proceeds thereof, to the extent required, shall be applied forthwith to the payment of the principal of and the interest on any such notes then outstanding or shall be deposited with a bank or trust company in trust for such purpose.
- Section 5. The First Selectman is authorized in the name and on behalf of the Town to apply for and accept any and all Federal and State loans and/or grants-in-aid of the Project and is further authorized to expend said funds in accordance with the terms hereof and in connection therewith, to contract in the name of the Town with engineers, contractors and others.
- Section 6. The Town hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and any time after the date of passage of this resolution in the maximum amount and for the Project with the proceeds of bonds or bond anticipation notes or other obligations ("Tax-Exempt Obligations") authorized to be issued by the Town. The Tax-Exempt Obligations shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Project, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The Town hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Financial Director or his designee is authorized to pay Project expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of Tax-Exempt Obligations,

and to amend this declaration.

## **LICENSE AGREEMENT**

This Agreement, made by and between the **TOWN OF NEWTOWN**, a Connecticut Municipal Corporation, acting herein by Dan Rosenthal, its First Selectman, duly authorized (hereinafter referred to as "Licensor") and Asylum Brewing Company LLC, (dba) **Newsylum Brewing Company**, a Connecticut corporation with an office and place of business in Newtown, Connecticut, acting herein by David Kingsley., Its Managing Member, duly authorized (hereinafter referred to as "Licensee).

WITNESSETH: That the Licensor does hereby license to the said Licensee the land designated as Line of Additional License Area on the Site Plan entitled, "Proposed Brewery at Stratford Hall, 36 Keating Farm Road, Newtown CT 06470" prepared by D.J. Kingsley Deign Build, dated 5/2/21, Exhibit A, for the term of twelve (12) months from the first day of June, 2021 and ending on May 31, 2022, for the total license fee of One Dollar (\$1.00)) payable at signing.





AND THE LICENSEE covenants that in the event the Licensor is required to employ an attorney in order to enforce a provision of this license, the Licensee shall pay a reasonable attorney's fee.
