BOROUGH OF NEWTOWN NEWTOWN, CONNECTICUT

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Borough of Newtown Board of Burgesses on **Tuesday, October 13, 2020**. The meeting was held remotely due to COVID-19 mandates and precautions.

Warden Maher called the meeting to order at 7:31p.m.

<u>Present</u>: Warden Jay Maher, Second Senior Burgess Betsy Kenyon, Burgess Bill Lucas, Burgess Bill Eder, Burgess Jim Gaston, Tax Collector Jodie Enriquez, Treasurer Paula Brinkman, Zoning Officer Rob Sibley, Tree Warden Rob McCulloch and Clerk Ann Scaia.

Absent: Burgess Anthony Baiad and Senior Burgess Chris Gardner.

Also Present: 2 members of the public.

A correction to the September 8, 2020 regular meeting minutes was requested. The minutes under the Streets & Parks sections should have read Burgess Eder rather than Warden Eder.

Burgess Eder made a motion to accept the September 8, 2020 regular meeting minutes with the change noted above, seconded by Burgess Lucas. Motion passed.

<u>Warden's Report</u>: Warden Maher took a moment to acknowledge Borough Zoning Officer Sibley's involvement and success in the special sidewalk project this past year.

Warden Maher regretted to announce Kathy Geckle was stepping down from the Borough Zoning Board of Appeals.

Burgess Gaston made a motion to appoint John Fletcher as Commission Member of the Borough Zoning Board of Appeals, seconded by Burgess Lucas and unanimously approved.

Warden Maher stated Main Street residents are relying on signage, social media and the Newtown Bee to get the message out for Halloween.

Warden Maher noticed there was a 180' gap in the tree line on South Main Street at Ram's Pasture and wishes to help the Newtown Cemetery Association restore the tree line. Tree Warden McCulloch suggested the new trees be planted inside the stonewall. He suggested we keep the species the same as the pre-existing maples on the property. Tree Warden confirmed the trees could be planted within the month.

Burgess Gaston made a motion to approved the installation of up to 4 trees of the same preexisting species on South Main Street along Ram's Pasture for a cost up to \$500/tree, seconded by Second Senior Burgess Kenyon and unanimously approved. Warden Maher also presented the topic of creating a fund balance. He has met with the Borough Auditor Glenn Nanavaty regarding this topic. Burgess Gaston suggested Warden Maher create a proposal and discuss it formally at the November Borough meeting.

<u>Tree Warden's Report</u>: Tree Warden McCulloch reported he continues clean up trees from the storm. Once it slows down, he would like to pursue projects with Borough Zoning Officer Sibley for clearing the area behind Marygold's on Main. Warden Maher was approached by a borough resident asking if the borough would consider replacing two fallen sycamores on The Boulevard. Tree Warden McCulloch stated he addresses stump removal once a list forms to make the cost more effective. He assured Warden Maher the stumps will be tended to. Tax Collector Enriquez also mentioned a hanging branch on Wendover. Tree Warden McCulloch stated he would look into the hangers.

<u>Tax Collector's Report</u>: Tax Collector Enriquez reported the following for Revised June Year End Report 2020: Taxes Collectable \$159,771.85; Current Taxes: \$160,648.06; Back Taxes: \$1,182.84; Interest: \$762.50; Liens & Fees: \$192.00. Total Submitted to Treasurer to Date: \$160,757.19. Current Taxes Collected: \$158,709.06 representing 99.25%. Please review attached report for Revised June Year End report 2020.

Burgess Gaston made a motion to accept the Tax Collector's Report for Revised June Year

End report 2020 with the clarification of \$18.00 line item being a Bank OD Fee & Bank

Deposit Error, seconded by Burgess Lucas and unanimously approved.

Tax Collector Enriquez reported the following for Revised August 2020: Taxes Collectable \$161,937.72; Current Taxes: \$153,658.75; Back Taxes: \$0.00; Interest: \$0.00; Liens & Fees: \$0.00. Total Submitted to Treasurer to Date: \$147,500.00. Current Taxes Collected: \$153,532.10 representing 95.80%. Please review attached report for Revised August 2020.

Burgess Gaston made a motion to accept the Tax Collector's Report for Revised August

2020 with the correction of \$151.33 in overpayments from prior years, seconded by

Burgess Eder and unanimously approved.

Tax Collector Enriquez reported the following for September 2020: Taxes Collectable \$161,937.72; Current Taxes: \$155,961.11; Back Taxes: \$0.00; Interest: \$8.01; Liens & Fees: \$0.00. Total Submitted to Treasurer to Date: \$155,900.00. Current Taxes Collected: \$155,834.46 representing 97.24%. Please review attached report for September 2020.

Burgess Gaston made a motion to accept the Tax Collector's Report for September 2020, seconded by Burgess Lucas and unanimously approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: The September 2020 report presents: A deposit of \$530.00 was made from the Borough Zoning Office. A deposit of \$6,000.00 was made from Tax Collector, Jodie Enriquez. A transfer of 21,800.00 was made to cover last month's invoicing. A transfer of \$6,530.00 was transferred into the ISC Account from the Borough Operating Account. A transfer

of \$21,800.00 was transferred from the ISC Account to the Borough Operating Account. Interest on the 12 mo. CD was \$115.23 making a total of \$78,636.94. Please review attached report for September 2020.

<u>Burgess Lucas made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report for September 2020</u>, seconded by Second Senior Burgess Kenyon and unanimously approved.

Zoning Officer's Report: Zoning Officer Sibley reported great activity in the Borough for applications, building and purchasing/selling of houses. There will be a Borough Zoning Commission meeting on Wednesday, October 28, 2020, to discuss a text amendment to apartments for residential houses in the Borough.

<u>Historic District</u>: Warden Maher have been discussing with Second Senior Burgess Kenyon on how weather and thievery has impacted historic signs. Warden Maher reported the sign at the base of Mt. Pleasant has been stolen. Warden Maher replaced it with an older historic sign for the time being. He reported a historic sign is down on Currituck Road and the historic sign is missing on West Street. Warden Maher suggested the installation of new posts and new historic signs should occur come Spring of 2021.

<u>Sidewalks</u>: Warden Maher reported we secured three (3) bids for the RFP for the replacement of the sidewalk at 35 Main Street. Unfortunately, all three bids were over our line item by significance. The lowest bid was with Titan Enterprises of Ansonia for \$12,800.00. Connecticut Bomanite came in at \$13,567.00 and last was Reliable Excavating for \$13,750.00. (see attached) Warden Maher and the Board of Burgesses agreed to reject the bids and re-bid at a future date with the intention of staying within the budgeted line item. Warden Maher will contact the contractors thanking them for their bid and would alert them at the time of re-bidding the project.

Burgess Gaston made a motion to reject the three bids for reasons of them being over budget by significance, seconded by Second Senior Burgess Kenyon and unanimously approved.

Streets & Parks: Burgess reported the Soldiers & Sailors monument has been sprayed and bleached. Burgess Eder did report a ghosting affect where the mold/mildew once was. Garrett Henchecliffe, of Paver Savers, suggested we wait until Spring to see if the ghosting subsides. Burgess Eder went onto report the pavers have been reset and sealed and the invoice has been processed for payment. An associate of Mr. Henchecliffe, submitted an estimate for the removal of grout at the base and up rights of the monument and repoint them for \$1,800. Burgess Eder will inquire if this includes the cost of removing all the existing concrete grout. Warden Maher reached out to Rob at Connor Landscaping to discuss the monument. Warden Maher will follow up on this conversation at the November Borough meeting. Burgess Eder conveyed to Mr. Henchecliffe that the project is on hold until further details and their costs can be confirmed. Warden Maher's goal is to have this project wrapped up by Thanksgiving.

<u>New Business</u>: Burgess Eder noted an article in The Bee regarding the Ram's Pasture Pond and the growing algae. Burgess Eder asked if perhaps the Borough would like to consider financially supporting the efforts to clear the pond.

Old Business: Second Senior Burgess Kenyon inquired if the annual donation to the Ram's Pasture Holiday Lighting Festival will be made soon. Borough Clerk Scaia stated the payment is designated for payment in November. Second Senior Burgess Kenyon will email Borough Clerk Scaia with the correct recipient name for the check. Burgess Gaston requested Second Senior Burgess Kenyon asks if the committee will return to candles rather than battery operated lights.

Public Participation: None.

The regular meeting of the Board of Burgesses will be held on Tuesday, November 10, 2020 at 7:30p.m.
