The Commission on Aging held a regular meeting on Monday, February 26, 2018 Edmond Town Hall, Lower Meeting Room, 45 Main Street, Newtown, CT.

Call to order: Mr. Guidera called the meeting to order at 5:03 pm.

VOTER COMMENTS: Karen Aurelia - requested to keep Commission On Aging meetings at the Senior Center.

Mary Maday – asked when the key fob system will be ready. Mid-March. Doug Lord – introduced himself as the new Director of the Cyrenius H. Booth Library.

MINUTES: MS. SCHMIDLE MOVED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF JANUARY 22, 2018 REGULAR MEETING. SECOND BY MS. BLOOM. ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION PASSES. (9-0)

REPORTS

DIRECTOR OF SENIOR SERVICES: Ms. Place distributed the monthly report, flyer, and program schedule, reviewed updates of events. (ATTACHMENT A) Independence Northwest has a new telephone number which should be added to the new resource directory if it has not yet been printed. There will be a presentation on Medicare and Medicaid on Wednesday, March 14, 10:30-11:30 at the Senior Center, in coordination with Western Connecticut Area Agency on Aging. When parking lot is full at the Senior Center, park at the Sandy Hook Fire Department. Bus service from the parking lot has been provided in the past and can be scheduled as needed. Ms. Place requested monies to cover program/event costs, not to exceed \$500.

MR. BOCCUZZI MOVED TO COVER PROGRAM/EVENT COSTS NOT TO EXCEED \$500. SECOND BY MS. WILL. ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION PASSES. (9-0)

As a result of an arts grant put forth by Ms. Bloom and Mr. Boccuzzi, a grant for a mural at the new Senior Center has been awarded, funding amount is \$4,000. Artists Joanne and Bruce Hunter of The Art Spot will oversee creation of the mural of which theme is "One Town." Ms. Hunter gave an overview of the installation process. The Hunters have created many pieces of public art in communities, town, cities, and corporations. Working collaboratively with community members, a mosaic is created, approx. 3' x 5', which will eventually be installed in the new Senior Center. The Commission On Aging will act as a steering committee during the process, along with Ms. Place and Mr. Boccuzzi, they will communicate to seniors upcoming dates for meetings. With some concern of time frame due to grant timeline and completion date of end of September, meetings dates were discussed with the possibility of the first meeting in mid-March

and another at the end of March. A timeline of meetings and installation schedule will be communicated to seniors as soon as possible.

DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL SERVICES: Ms. LoBosco distributed the Director of Social Services report. (ATTACHMENT B) Discussed transportation options for seniors Be Driven, Hart, Fish, Uber. Consideration of a pamphlet with available transportation resources suggested. Look into grants for transportation services. Mr. Boccuzzi noted transportation is one of the topics during the upcoming Livable Communities workshop on April 28 at Newtown High School.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Ms. Rothstein indicated no changes.

CHAIR/VICE CHAIR REPORT: Mr. Guidera distributed the chair report (ATTACHMENT C).

Buddy Program: as noted in the Chairman Report, Ms. Wiedemann will reach out to seniors with more information.

Livable Community: reminder about the upcoming Livable Community workshop on April 28 at Newtown High School.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Schmidle commented that the Senior Center in Southington opened this week, and has a pickle ball court, ping pong, and pool tables.

VOTER COMMENTS: Marie McClenathan, Nunnawauk Meadows – Ms. McClenathan asked for clarification on potential walkway between Fairfield Hills and Nunnawauk Meadows. There will be a publicized meeting in the spring, date to be announced by the Town, questions and comments will be reviewed, no date set as of yet. Ms. McClenathan asked about the process of choosing the artist for the Senior Center mural, it was explained that the state had a list of approved artists to choose from. Another voter asked about the sources of funding for the mural, it is a state grant that is comprised of state and federal funding.

Program Statistics

Energy Assistance Applications – 2017-2018 (152 applications – 99 Senior/Disabled = 65%) Food Pantry (45 individuals/families visit weekly – 30 Senior/Disabled = 66%) Operation Fuel (Winter program) – (5 applications – 3 Seniors = 60%) Salvation Army – (12 applications to date - \$4,124.11 total – 7 Senior/Disabled = 58%) Goodwill gift cards – 4 distributed

- Helped a couple apply for Title 19 (Long term care/home care). Had to bring in Protective Services for the Elderly because wife needed help caring for husband in the home while the application is being processed. Process is ongoing.
- Working with a senior who is currently in Masonicare Rehab who has been experiencing elder abuse at her home from a man who lives with her. She allowed the homeless man to live with her but now regrets doing so and wants him to leave due to verbal abuse, etc. I am working with a case manager from Value Care Alliance, case manager from CT Home Care, and Linda from Masonicare to insure her safety when returning to her home. We are taking steps to petition the court for a conservator and obtain a restraining/protective order (hoping not to have to go through an eviction process).
- Working on several other cases of elderly needing assistance with home care and/or transportation this is becoming a growing problem. Senior housing options are limited; family members live a distance away (or there are no family members).
- The MSP program and its income limits are valid past the July 2018 date under approved statute according to Senator Hwang. However, the Governor's proposed budget eliminates funding for the 2018-2019 budget year. Senator Hwang is "committed to restoring the funds and will push to encourage his legislative colleagues to again override the wrong policy approach of the Governor".

Thank you to Barbara Bloom, Maureen Will (and JoAnne Albanesi) who came to help with signing Nunnawauk Meadow residents for Smart 911, Code Red and the File of Life. Not well attended, but I will make sure we reach out to them again. Thank you too to Marilyn for ordering the File of Life. I left about 10 with Linda Uhde at Nunnawauk Meadows for residents.

I spoke to Lorrie Rodrigue regarding the "Buddy" program and she loved the idea of reading to the elementary school age children. Once I get the go ahead from her regarding the participating schools, we'll make sure to reach out to our Senior population. We'll send e mails, post it on the town website, our new website and anywhere else you feel would be appropriate. Just drop me a line and I'll make sure we cover all our bases.

I met with Dorrie Carolan from Parent Connection. We had a guest, Stephanie Paulmeno, who is a nurse (and so much more!) who will be doing a Lunch and Learn at the Senior Center on Friday, May 4th from 10-1. 10-11 she will speak, 11-12 questions and answers and 12-1 lunch. The topic will be Living With (OUT) Pain, Safe Solutions to Pain Management. Many hands will be needed to help. John Boccuzzi was there representing FONS, Donna Culbert from the Health Department and Jennifer Crane with Newtown Center for Support and Wellness as well as Dorrie Carolan, Director of Parent Connection. Marilyn Place was not able to attend because of a previously scheduled trip with the Senior Center, but will also be part of this group. Stephanie will speak to Seniors and professionals. Another meeting will be held, Tuesday, May 15, geared towards family members (siblings, parents, etc.) and caregivers as a follow up to the information presented on 5/4.
